President's Column

General Assembly of the Unitarian Universalist Association will be June 21-25 in Pittsburgh. JoEllen Essex and I are planning to attend General Assembly (GA), and are willing to be voting delegates. The number of delegates is determined by the number of members of the congregation. If there are others who want to be delegates to General Assembly, I'm sure we can come to an agreement on how to cast our 2 congregational votes. Rev. Ma will also attend GA.

Recommendations, including revisions to Article II, Principles and Purposes of the Unitarian Universalists Association Bylaws, will be presented at GA. Article II holds the covenant that member congregations pledge when becoming members of the UUA. It has also been the section containing the Seven Principles. The decision to be made this year is NOT the adoption of the proposal of the Article II Study Commission, but rather whether to advance the revision to a vote at the 2024 General Assembly. Delegates to GA will also vote for a new President of the Association; Rev. Dr. Sophia Betancourt is the only candidate for UUA President (Another dropped out of consideration.)

JoEllen and I have been doing some study of the revisions recommended to Article II, but want to hear what your feelings are about this important vote. For more information on the adoption and amendment process, and to read the full report of the Article II Study Commission, please visit uua.org/a2sc. I've learned that there were initially 6 Principles 60 years ago when the UUA Bylaws were first written after the merger of the Unitarians and Universalists, that the Seventh Principle was added about 40 years ago, and that the patriarchal language of the Principles was changed during the Women's Movement. The last revision of Article II was in 1987. The language of the proposed revision includes all of the Seven Principles and also the Eighth Principle, but with calls to live into the values, not just to covenant to affirm and promote them. While the online deadline was April 30 for amendments, amendments can be made by delegates until June 5. There are 3 online discussions of amendments scheduled in May.

Please go to <u>uua.org/a2sc</u> for details of these amendment discussions and the voting process.

Please contact me and/or JoEllen to let us know your opinions so that our votes at General Assembly will consider your views. We'll give you a report when we return!

If you didn't complete the Search Committee Survey, you will receive a phone call from either a Transition Team member or a Board member. Please let your Board know who you think should be appointed to Search Committee to look for UCF's full-time contract minister to begin in 2024.



The Racial Justice Group under the umbrella of the Social Justice Committee is requesting that the UCF Board put the following Resolution on the Agenda for the Annual Meeting on June 11, 2023!

We, the congregation of the Unitarian Coastal Fellowship vote to pass this existing <u>8th Principle</u> at our **June 11, 2023, Annual Meeting**.

"We covenant to affirm and promote: journeying toward spiritual wholeness by working to build a diverse and multicultural Beloved Community by our actions that accountably dismantle racism and other oppressions in ourselves and our institutions."

We have had very positive feedback for the continuation of our educational groups to learn more about racism and how we can become more involved in building our local Beloved Community. The Racial Justice Group offered three sessions at two different time frames this spring that provided an opportunity for the entire congregation to engage in the discussion of "how and why" this could and should happen.

Our goal is to see UCF continue the hope-filled work ahead to make the 8th Principle a reality! We sincerely hope the UCF Board and Congregation will support this official action Item on the June 11, 2023, Annual Meeting Agenda.



Tips from the Team

Pastoral Care Tip

Have you looked out of your window recently? Try it! Look out the window and see if you notice any birds, flowers, or insects. Let your mind wander; you might stumble across a new idea. If the sun is up, looking out the window can also reset your circadian rhythm with natural sunlight and improve your mental health and your ability to fall asleep. Taking a few minutes to notice the world around you is never a waste of time.





Green Tip

You're sleeping peacefully on a spring night, and suddenly you're awakened by a noise on your back deck. Could it be a raccoon, an opossum, or a bear!?! Or you're enjoying a cup of afternoon tea while watching the beautiful birds at your backyard feeder and laughing at the antics of your squirrels. These are the delights of encouraging wildlife in your backyard. Even in town, you can make your backyard wildlife friendly. Select native berry-bearing shrubs; plant a pollinator-friendly flowering plants and a few native trees; leave dead and dying trees (ones that don't threaten your house!) – these provide food for wood-boring insects and the woodpeckers who eat them; provide water in a small pond or birdbath, and, please, keep it clean; provide food such as corn, peanuts, and birdseed at ground level. With a few amendments, your backyard can become an enjoyable wildlife sanctuary – beneficial for both the wildlife and for you!
