President's Column

Coastline Article May 2024, From the President

Unitarian Universalism is a living tradition, and part of living is changing and growing. UCF recently had a New Member Sunday welcoming seventeen new members! Woohoo! Hurray! Brilliant! I'm looking forward to getting to know all of you better! Watch UCF grow!

The member congregations of the Unitarian Universalist Association have met yearly in June for business meetings, workshops, and worship at the General Assembly since 1961 when the Unitarians and the Universalists merged. This year's Virtual only General Assembly includes a vote on a proposed revision of Article 2 of the UUA Bylaws. Article 2 states the purposes and covenant of the Association and its member congregations. Because Unitarian Universalism is a living tradition not a static one, its purposes and covenant in Article 2 of its bylaws have had several revisions over the years.

In the past, UCF delegates have voted their own conscience, but because this is a major revision of the UUA Bylaws, I am proposing that there be a congregational vote at the June UCF Annual Meeting to direct UCF's two voting delegates' votes on this issue. JoEllen Essex and I were UCF delegates to GA in 2023, and voted on the proposal to advance the revision of Article 2 for a vote at the 2024 General Assembly.

The final proposed revision of Article 2, the letter from the Article 2 Study Commission, and the letter from the UUA Board can be found at this link.

Please take time to read the proposal and the process used by the Study Commission to arrive at this document so that you have the information you need to vote at the UCF Annual Meeting in June. One concern expressed is that the Unitarian Universalist Principles currently in Article 2 are going away. While the Principles are not stated in the same way in the revision, I think you will find that the proposed revision includes the Seven Principles plus the Eighth Principle that UCF and many other congregations have adopted. It goes further to state not only does the UUA and its member congregations covenant "to affirm and promote" the principles but also promises to do the work, centered in love, needed to make the world a better place living the shared values of justice, equity, transformation, pluralism, interdependence, and generosity.

Children & Family Ministries From Sarah Grenier

On Sundays with no RE, the kids have asked me, "why didn't we go back to our classroom?!" Even my own son excitedly confirms every morning before we go to church now, "are we going to be in the kid's room?" I hope that's a sign that they are having fun together and slowly absorbing the things we talk about!

In the RE classroom, I've been trying out spirit play style stories with Confucius and the story about a little turtle in the polluted ocean. The kids seemed to enjoy the stories, and we had activities afterwards that related to the story of the day. I'm introducing them to the seven UU principles and how our stories relate to those values. I'm trying to get the kids into a class rhythm and to work through socialemotional conflicts.

In the nursery, we've started care before service. There have been a lot of BIG emotions about this change which is totally normal. Young children do not like to be separated from their parents. However, we must stretch our comfort zones sometimes and know that they will be okay (for our sake as much as theirs). I will continue to rotate toys and make it an engaging environment.

I want to give a BIG BIG BIG thank you to the members who have donated items to children's RE from our wishlist including Wendy, Dave, Susan, and a mystery donor. We've used all these items so far!

We promise ourselves to be the village that raises the child, because we know: none of us do this alone.

A liberal theology of generosity is grounded in our first principle, the inherent worth and dignity of every person. We are worthy of generosity and our dignity compels us to be generous. The Article II Study Commission chose generosity as a value to guide our faith into the future and we will explore this topic in this Touchstones worship service led by Marilynn Cullison.

GET READY FOR UU THE VOTE

Here's a heads up about this year's UU the Vote rollout. This is a nationwide effort by UU's all over the country to get people out to vote. Social Justice Committee co-chairs Harriet and Barb will be participating in a "Captain's Rollout" about the time this newsletter is getting out to you and the rollout for all participants will be on May 14 th at 7:00 PM on Zoom. For that, we will be joined by National UU the Vote Organizer, Nora Rasman, Carolina Jews for Justice Executive Director Abby Lublin, and other guests from our partner organizations across NC. What can you expect from "UU the Vote"?

- We will be asked to write postcards to potential voters. We have done this several times in the past. There has been much research that has found that handwritten postcards that contain voting information in an inviting format are very effective.
- We will be eligible to apply for a \$500 grant from UUA to pay for the postcard materials. Everyone in the congregation, including older children, can volunteer to participate. Usually, they are done in a packet of 20 postcards. You will be given a sample to copy from, colored pens, postcards, a list of names and addresses, and stamps.
- Another option will be phone banking to get out the vote. This also can be done from the comfort of your own home.

Your Social Justice chairs are excited about the opportunity to participate in a statewide effort to "UU the Vote"! This is an effort we can all work on together!!

Mental Health Family Support Group Tuesdays, 10am (Zoom)


