Congratulations Rev. Leslie on your ordination in New Orleans on October 20, 2024. We are excited as a congregation to work with you to be the best we all can be.

In September your Board of Trustees, Leadership Council, Minister Leslie, and Sarah Grenier met to plan out our future work as the Unitarian Coastal Fellowship. We identified a number of areas to work on. One area was support for the Children and Family Ministry program headed up by Sarah. On October 20th, a group of 14 folks met to learn to be volunteers for the Nursery and Classroom programs. We love our children and young families, and we will support them. Another area we discussed at our Retreat was Leadership Development. It takes leadership to run the church. There are many tasks and programs that need folks to dedicate some time to keep everything running smoothly. During our services we have our Minster, Rev Leslie for 3 Sundays a month and folks doing the other jobs. We need to folks to greet at the door, they make the first connection with new visitors.

We are developing a Security Team that is responsible for door control and communication with the other building. We have a tech team, working to produce a zoom service, producing and running the projected slides, and working the sound system. We have Worship Associates assisting on stage during the service. We have coffee makers, snack prep, and clean up after service. Please volunteer to help out, it is a great way to meet members of the congregation. We use the Breeze system for job sign-up, it is quick and easy. We have a number of standing committees, that meet on a regular basis. We meet to plan worship services, bring in new members and nurture existing ones, handle our finances, organize social action initiatives, care for our building and grounds, and care for our children.
