Greetings Beloveds of Unitarian Coastal Fellowship!

Worship for the month of February will have a theme of Inclusion, and the music team is going to start using an "anthem" each month. We will learn one song a month, hearing it and singing it all four Sundays – this way we don't have to focus so much on learning the tune or following the music or understanding the words – we will get to a point where we "feel" the song and we can take it deeper into our spiritual practices. The song for this month is #95 There Is More Love Somewhere ... hallelujah, more love!

We also begin our annual pledge drive starting in February – this is the season where we, as a spiritual community, put our gratitude and generosity into practice and we fund our ministries. We will be Riding the Wave of Growth – as we are seeing such a widening of our community as new families seek our liberal faith tradition. It is exciting time to be growing, when many other faith communities are not.

- Thoughtful Gatherings return in the Spring! These are small group meetings that take place in a home, where each person is given time to respond to spiritual questions and prompts. 

SHARE THE PLATE

December's Share the Plate collection went to The Bridge Down East -- a non-profit organization that seeks to have a positive impact on the Down East Community in Carteret County NC by offering a variety of programs throughout the year. As a youth center, they promote a community approach to enrichment, offering support, hope and inspiration for our youth as well as families in the community. We raised \$869.72 for this organization.

For the month of February, we will be sharing the plate with the Disaster Relief Fund of Crooked Media, a media organization located in Los Angeles which has vetted charities that are working to help those that have lost some or all of their possessions and housing, as well as those helping to fight the fires. They have selected charities to be sure that donations have the highest impact. Currently donations are being split between the following charities:

- Latino Community Foundation
- Los Angeles Regional Food Bank
- Los Angeles Fire Department Foundation
- United Way of Greater Los Angeles
- California Community Foundation Wildfire Relief Fund
- Inclusive Action for the City

The UCF Social Justice Committee usually selects local organizations for receive our Share the Plate donations but in this case, we thought the numbers of people affected and the devastation we have seen on our TV screens warranted breaking that tradition.




Come meditate with us on Zoom on Monday afternoons. You can sign on between 5:30 and 5:40 and meditation will be from 5:40 to 6:00.
